### Regional Chairs Foreword



Thank you to everyone for your contribution to HASSRA West Midlands over the past year. 2022 was once again the year when HASSRA West Midlands was crowned the Best Regional Association, it is a massive honour and in recognition of everyone's hard work and dedication throughout the region – thank you very much!

The past year has been one of transition and returning to normal for the association following the pause on events and activities due to the previous years of the pandemic. We've dealt with that remarkably well as you will see throughout this Annual Report - our member participations have returned to a healthy level for events and they will only get better in the year ahead, along with fantastic take up for competitions, shows and great engagement at local club level. We really do have a lot to look forward to in 2023!

West Midlands membership currently stands at 4,412 members (at 31/12/2022). We've seen a big decline in regional membership over the past year, something we do need to address in the next 12 months, to both attract new members and importantly retain existing ones. We also need to ensure members who are retiring or leaving the Department for pastures new, are aware that they can remain a HASSRA member beyond life in DWP.

At a time when we are all dealing with the cost of living challenges, HASSRA is able to offer great savings and some light enjoyable relief for members. Our range of cashback initiatives, competitions, discounted theatre shows and cinema ticket subsidies have saved members in excess of £27,000 over the past year. In addition, we've had yet another bumper year for regional winners in the HASSRA National Lottery, with a total of 123 West Midlands members winning a collective sum of £60,400 in prize money.

Our local clubs have once again done a superb job raising money for various local and national charities. Thanks to the generosity of colleagues across the region, our network of clubs raised a fantastic £6,776.86 (reported at the time of publication). I must say a huge congratulations and thank you to our award-winning regional drama group, who in November, raised a fantastic £1,135.10 for Birmingham homelessness support charity SIFA Fireside from tickets sales for their production of 'Walk On By'.

My challenge to you all this year is to think about how the association needs to evolve now that we've fully embraced hybrid working. The traditional local club and regional activities need to change now that colleagues aren't always working in offices. How do you keep those individuals fully involved with HASSRA and reaping the rewards when they may not always be on site? I'd welcome any thoughts you may have on how we can do things even better moving forwards.

I must finish by saying a huge thank you to everyone who has supported HASSRA at both a local club and regional level over the past year. Your hard work and dedication doesn't go unrecognised and I am extremely grateful and appreciative of everything you do. Here's to a thoroughly enjoyable and extremely successful 2023.



### Regional Events & Festivals

#### **HASSRA Festivals:**

A highlight of HASSRA's national calendar are the Festivals, taking place in July and September each year at the University of Warwick campus. The Festivals see HASSRA members from the 12 regions compete and volunteer across the weekend, with around 600 HASSRA members attending.

**July Festival:** 42 HASSRA West Midlands members competed at the July Festival. Regional qualifiers were held, with expressions of interest offered for some events to create more inclusivity to members. West Midlands had one winner at the July Festival – Maria Watch who won the Contemporary Music category.

**September Festival:** The September Festival was cancelled due to the passing of the late Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The Festival has now been rescheduled to take place over the weekend of 31st March – 2nd April 2023.
