Regional Chair's Foreword



Thank you to everyone for your contribution to HASSRA over the past year. 2023 has been an exceptional year for HASSRA West Midlands; we've delivered a huge programme of activities over the past 12 months, made even more impressive as every single thing we've done has been delivered by you as volunteers, in your own personal time, and for that I am extremely grateful.

One of the biggest achievements of 2023 is that we have grown our membership, evidently due to our fantastic regional offer. West Midlands membership currently stands at 4,501 members (at 31/12/2023), that's <u>an increase of +89 members over the past year</u>. Everyone has played a part in this increase, from discussions with new joiners at induction, the local club recruitment challenge we ran, and also the awareness presentations the Regional Board have delivered to new colleagues throughout the year. It shows that these activities do work, and we will continue them into 2024.

Members continue to face cost of living challenges; it is fantastic to see that HASSRA continues to offer great savings during this difficult time. Our range of cashback initiatives, competitions, discounted theatre shows and cinema and theme park ticket subsidies have saved members in excess of £40,000 over the past year. In addition, we've had yet another bumper year for regional winners in the HASSRA National Lottery, with a total of 109 West Midlands members winning a collective sum of £126,100 in prize money. This Annual Report is packed full of facts and figures to help you promote HASSRA within your offices so please do share it and use the numbers to encourage colleagues to join the association.

Our local clubs have once again done a superb job raising money for various local and national charities. Thank you to colleagues who give so generously to so many worthy causes every single year, especially at a time when everyone has less to spend. Throughout 2023, we raised an incredible £9,823.23 for charity.

Looking ahead to 2024, we will continue to grow our network of local clubs so that more members feel the benefit of HASSRA within their offices. We're currently guiding around half a dozen offices through the process of setting up a new HASSRA club locally. Engagement and communication is something I'm also passionate about, we've made great strides over the past year in communicating with our local clubs to build a community, our Local Club Connect quarterly meetings have helped to share regular updates on activities within the association and we'll continue to develop these into 2024, along with an event for club officials which we are planning for June - more on that shortly.

Finally, a huge thank you to everyone who has supported HASSRA at both a local club and regional level over the past year. Your hard work and dedication doesn't go unrecognised, and I am extremely grateful and appreciative of everything you do. My personal thanks to our Regional President Helene Dearn - since taking on the role last year Helene has advocated HASSRA at every opportunity.

Many thanks for your continued support and most importantly for everything you do.



Recruitment & Engagement

Recruit & Reward Club Challenge

- The local club challenge ran from 01/08/2023 to 31/12/2023 with financial rewards for clubs with the highest membership percentage increase. 262 new members were recruited during the 5 months of the challenge.
- Clubs with the highest percentage increase were:
 - Walsall Crown Wharf HASSRA 17.1%
 - Dudley JCP HASSRA 14.9%
 - Erdington JCP HASSRA 12.3%
 - Shrewsbury HASSRA 10.5%
 - Telford New Town House HASSRA 10.4%

Local Club Connect:

- Quarterly engagement sessions with local clubs, lasting up to 1 hour via Microsoft Teams.
- Providing an opportunity for local clubs to:
 - Hear about what's going on across the association at a national and regional level.
 - Seek help and advice.
 - Share ideas and best practice.
 - Build the local club community.

Introduction to HASSRA Events:

• A number of awareness presentations were delivered throughout the year to promote HASSRA amongst new recruits and encourage them to join the association. Events took place on 05/10/2023, 10/10/2023, 20/10/2023 and 15/11/2023. These events will continue in 2024.

Cinema Tickets:

- West Midlands members purchased 11,359 cinema tickets in 2023.
- HASSRA West Midlands subsidised ticket costs by £13,475.33.

Theme Parks & Attractions:

- Nationally HASSRA sold 26,787 tickets to theme parks and attractions throughout the UK in 2023.
- Saving members a total of £274,147.00.
- A 40.62% saving on the general admission walk up price.

Regional Events:

- 533 West Midlands members attended regional events and national Festivals in 2023.
