HASSRA - Making a Splash!

On 4th October HASSRA fielded a team in a new swimming competition. We were up against His Majesty's Revenue and Customs and Home Office / Probation Services, at the Corby International Pool in Northamptonshire.

The HASSRA team was made up of 21 swimmers with ages ranging from 20s to 70s!

The swimmers hailed from across the whole country, with almost half being newcomers to this National Team.

The competition lasted all day, at a frantic pace, to allow 36 different events. In addition to the swimmers' individual races HASSRA fielded 29 relay teams. It is fair to say that all were very tired at the end of the day.

A very complicated points system rewarded swimmers, both for their position in races and the number of events they competed in. You could tell somebody from the Inland Revenue had designed it!

Our top woman overall was one of our new swimmers, Susan Rees from Houghton-le-Spring.

Our top man overall was Richard Drew from North Wales who currently works for Maximus, one of our contractors.

Richard and Susan were presented at poolside with HASSRA trophies, as were the team manager's choice for best individual performances, Beatrice Telfer and Martin Raggett.

Highlights of the day included Martin Raggett and Susan Rees winning their age groups for 100 metres Individual Medley, Jude Barton winning her age group for 50 metres Breaststroke in a time of 51.48 seconds, which also beat most of the younger swimmers! And the women winning both the 4 x 25 metres Medleys and Freestyle relays.

Appropriately, the best performance of the day came in the last relay event where teams of six swimmers (three men and three women) each swam 50 metres. Eight teams went into this event including three from HASSRA and in a very close finish, the HASSRA A-Team won!

We didn't win the competition overall – we were second behind HMRC, but all competitors agreed it was a great event.

Feedback from previous festivals gave us some food for thought on what to change for 2024 so here is what some of your ideas helped us to change.

You Said - Be more Inclusive.

With Inclusivity being super important to HASSRA, we welcomed [Activity Alliance](#) to both festivals. As a leading voice for disability, they set up inclusion zones for our members to try adapted sporting activities in a safe welcoming space. Feedback has been very positive, and we aim to work closely with Activity Alliance on an ongoing basis to support our members.

You Said - Dinner service takes too long.

We trialled a less formal style of service with food stations giving you choices from a variety of dishes. Whilst it certainly speeded up mealtime, and allowed the Dancing Queen to reach the dancefloor faster, we recognise there is still work to do here to make it even better. Food is still the hottest topic! After a full-on day of sporting and recreational activities – fuelling you up is important to us.

You Said - We want different more varied events – more accessible.

The Programme Delivery Committee review the events offered each year and work with the University to make sure our programme is current and varied as well as inclusive. 2024 Festivals introduced three new events. Wild Swimming combined with Paddleboarding tuition proved to be a big hit at a lake off campus. A walking event was brought to you courtesy of [Living Streets Charity](#) and we also saw another new event, what's The Name of the Game again? – Oh yes, a Walking Football Tournament was introduced and fiercely contested by some very fast walkers.

We had almost 1,100 participants in attendance which was a fantastic turnout. We would love to see more new faces in 2025 which will be a special year for HASSRA as we will celebrate our 90th Year.

HASSRA Message Boards

We are delighted to introduce you to HASSRA Message Boards, a new and exciting feature of HASSRA Live providing all members, volunteers and officials with the opportunity to share thoughts, ideas and important information in a safe and secure online environment.

We have developed an area of the website which gives members access to create, share and comment upon items that might be of interest to like-minded colleagues. You can keep things at a local level on your Regional Message Board, or if you've something to say that has wider appeal you can spread the word across all 12 regions on the National Message Board.

Message Boards are also a fantastic way to get feedback on your ideas by using the 'Poll' function which allows you to ask specific questions relating to your post along with a deadline for colleagues to submit their responses.

For the protection of all users, you must be signed in to your HASSRA Live account to access **Message Boards** - whether you are posting, commenting or merely viewing content. There is an option to like (thumbs up) and dislike (thumbs down) posts and comments. If you feel any content is inappropriate and should not be on the Message Boards, you can report this using the red flag which will automatically notify the National team and One of Us will then take the appropriate steps to address your concerns.

We want as many members as possible to engage with Message Boards. They are extremely easy to use but we have this handy **user guide** to show you how to get started. Please remember that we want this to be a safe space for everyone, so think carefully about what you post and about whom you post it! Message Boards are covered by the HASSRA Code of Conduct, specifically its Social Media Policy*.

*HASSRA will not tolerate harassment, discrimination, or defamation using our social media channels, including HASSRA Message Boards. HASSRA will undertake routine monitoring to protect members, and any misuse of our social media channels may result in disciplinary action, which may then be referred to your employer for further action. Please also check your own employer's code of conduct and social media policy for your information.



How the **HASSRA Development Fund** helped me to continue to pursue my passion

It's a cold Thursday evening and I scroll through my e-mails, working on my brand-new laptop kindly funded through the **HASSRA Development Fund**. Without this financial support, my progression on the Wolverhampton Community Project would have been very limited. I have many tasks to complete including updating a dedicated web page to outline the project. I am passionate about driving community engagement and educational opportunities – my background is in developing community arts programmes.

I have delivered many projects in previous years for hospitals and designed art installations for public spaces and health care facilities to help enhance the environment and provide 'story telling' through art.

Keen to return to project delivery after an absence, I asked the Tettenhall District Community Trust to Take a Chance on Me and they have entrusted me as Volunteer Project Manager to deliver an exciting, historical and arts project in Wolverhampton called "**The Aethelflaed Trail.**"

This is an initiative to honour Aethelflaed, Lady of Mercia, and the inception of Anglo-Saxon England with the battles of Tettenhall and Wodensfield in 910 A.D. through a permanent art and educational trail. The battle itself was said to have been momentous, occurring between Anglo Saxons and Viking Warriors.

The trail will be a dedicated historical walk complete with commissioned art works allowing the public to engage in an enriching experience which is hoped will be beneficial to physical and mental health in the community.

My email from a top archaeological expert is exciting. He has links with Tony Robinson of "Time Team" fame and has been in contact with him. They are very interested in the project and want to explore further. Bingo! This will definitely help secure wider coverage for the initiative.

I am really going to have to demonstrate my project management skills to juggle this alongside my day job as a Change Manager for DWP!

Life can be unavoidably difficult sometimes for many of us, bereavement and illness caused me to withdraw and affected my ability to engage with people or do my artwork or project management, which were always so important to me. Pursuing dreams can also be costly and seem out of reach – my advice is never give up.

With HASSRA's help from the **Development Fund** – my dream is rekindled and with grit and determination – and a new laptop – I will achieve my goals!

Can we tell you the good news or the other good news? Ok - the good news is that your monthly subscriptions will not be increasing in 2025 and will remain excellent value at **£2.45 per month**. The other good news we are excited to share with you is that we have increased the total annual Lottery fund to over **£1 million!** And increased the number of Lottery prizes each month to 150, (that's 1800 per year). The monthly Lottery Jackpot will also be increasing from £15K to £20K – and - two other lucky winners will be in with a chance to win £10K each – but you must be in it to win it! We spoke with some of our lottery winners and here is what they told us.

"Winning £15,000 in the September HASSRA lottery was a massive shock - I thought it must be an error and, even after claiming my prize, was in complete denial until the money landed safely in my account around a week later.

The timing couldn't have been better, the first thing I did was pay off the family holiday we'd booked for next July. The first monthly payment had been due in early October and being able to clear the balance in one go saved us almost £1,000 a month!

Fate being as it is, the day after the winnings arrived the Universe took a large chunk out of the pot when our water tank sprang a leak, damaging the living room ceiling and requiring installation of a new boiler and heating system.
