HASSRA Living Life

A Step Back in Time

Nestled in the heart of County Durham, Beamish Museum, is a world-famous living, working, open air museum bringing history alive in the North East of England. The story is brought to life through costumed folk, and you will discover fascinating stories of everyday life throughout the years with its 1900's town and Pit Village, as well as a 1940's farm and a 1950's town and exhibition areas.

Like many of the North East HASSRA clubs, HASSRA Sunderland has two corporate passes to Beamish Museum, allowing up to ten people to visit the museum every day it is open, at a hugely discounted price. An adult ticket would normally cost £33, and we sell to our members at £5 for up to five people then an extra £1 per person up to a maximum of ten people.

Beamish has recently opened the 1950's Town, which includes a cinema, an electrical shop, a toy shop, and a welfare hall. Various exhibitions and features can be found in the welfare hall, from the story of the NHS and baby clinics to short-term installations.

One exhibition that was opening was close to my mam's heart. It featured the materials and crafts used by the Women's Institute (WI) during its 110-year history, primarily displaying banners, posters and "craftivist" items.

My mam recently retired after 40 years in the DWP and one of the banners on display had been made by Rose Sanders, a friend and colleague of hers who was also a Civil Servant for 40 years and a member of the WI. As Rose couldn't make the journey to see it herself, my mam and I were on a mission to find it on her behalf and find it we did!

For an amazing £5, I booked our tickets, courtesy of HASSRA Sunderland and the exhibition was wonderful, so much history contained in scraps of fabric and material that women through the ages spent hours and hours crafting. It's hard not to be humbled by the tangible reminder of what women endured to find empowerment and a place in society, from the Suffragette movement to the various waves of Feminism, fighting for equality and equity for all women.

We explored the 1950's Town which proved to be somewhat emotional for my mam, who recognised her childhood in the houses and shops that looked just like she remembered them as a little girl, bringing back memories of her parents and family members that we had lost over the years.

It was a wonderful trip, and all thanks to the HASSRA Beamish passes and our wonderful HASSRA team who do everything they can to find new benefits and ways to make life better for our members. The wider community also benefits as any excess income from the use of the passes is donated to Charity. In 2024 we donated £723 to a dementia care facility!

One Runner's Journey to the London Marathon

Peel Park's Green Mission

The "Give Nature a Home" Club at Peel Park was founded with a clear mission: to protect, encourage, and celebrate the rich wildlife that calls our site home. Our club offers members:

- A chance to learn about local habitats and wider conservation
- · Opportunities to boost wellbeing through nature-based activities
- Inclusive participation in conservation projects for all abilities

Our core objectives focus on protecting, reintroducing, and sustaining natural wildlife on site. We proudly align our efforts with the DWP Greening Government agenda, and we're thrilled to see our biodiversity score at Peel Park steadily rising – a testament to the passion and commitment of our members.

A Year of Growth and Impact

Throughout 2024, we worked hard to raise awareness of our club, growing our membership to over 60 at one point. We hosted information stalls, led guided nature walks, and introduced new feeding stations and birdboxes. We also took steps to enhance our natural ponds and supported the No Mow May initiative - helping protect our site's rare Bee Orchids and Marsh Orchids.

Recognition and Rewards

We were absolutely delighted to be named Single Activity Club of the Year – a proud moment that recognised the dedication of our members. The award came with a welcome £100 prize, which, along with £90 from the HASSRA 90 celebrations, has helped us upgrade our birdboxes and keep our feathered friends well fed.

As a small token of appreciation, we've named one of our new birdboxes "HASSRA90" — the name will be painted on once the breeding season ends, so we don't disturb any current residents!

Despite some members relocating to the new Fylde View site in Blackpool town centre, we're excited to build on our success and continue making Peel Park a thriving haven for nature.
