# Staying Safe, Active & Well

What a year it's been so far! Most of the usual HASSRA activities were curtailed by Covid 19 restrictions but, in addition to the sterling efforts of regional and club volunteers around the country, we have been running our Lockdown programme to keep members engaged and involved throughout.

HASSRA Lockdown is about getting involved, inspiring others and being rewarded. Participation has been really encouraging. The revised programme has so far attracted over 100,000 member engagements across the whole country.

Hundreds of members regularly get involved with the Puzzles and Smart Quizzes to test their grey matter and win prizes.

Others have taken part in the Art, Photography and Writing competitions, exploring their creative side with some fantastic entries and worthy winners.

Members have also been keeping fit, active and engaged with the Cycling Challenge, Let's Get Moving and Yoga & Meditation.

Offices around the country have benefited from thousands of pounds

in extra grants allowing colleagues to receive some extra treats during these difficult times.

About You, Rainbow, Summer Staycation and Back to School gave members the chance to share their Lockdown stories with colleagues near and far.

Plus, all the fantastic competitions and prize draws, including the £85k HASSRA's 85th Anniversary and the £50k Christmas Cracker.

# CYCLING CHALLENGE

A total of 145 HASSRA members joined the Cycling Challenge in July and August, and on average each week together cycled around 6,000 kilometres, equivalent to riding to Moscow and back. These rides also included climbs of a staggering 55 kilometres, equivalent to riding up Mount Everest six-and-a-half times.

And on an individual basis, hats off to Mark Johnson who on Sunday 9th August cycled 177.20 kilometres, with a total climb of 3,271 metres (very nearly Ben Nevis and Snowdon together!). And Andy Millett who on Saturday 29th August cycled 215.84 kilometres, with a total climb of 246 metres.

You can see the full results on the Cycling Sportive pages. But it's not just about our top riders: everyone who has taken part, whatever the level of their personal challenge, has contributed and made a difference. Your stories and pictures have been fun and informative, and your messages of support and "Kudos" have been inspiring.

One rider whose ongoing effort and commitment stood out was Osian Wyn Hughes from HASSRA West Midlands. He told us:

Back in September 2019, I completed a 300-mile cycle challenge and raised over £850\* for Cancer Research. I was overwhelmed by last year's sponsorship and decided this year's challenge would need to be something much bigger. I still wanted to raise money for Cancer Research as my chosen charity, after losing two uncles to this dreaded disease. CANCER RESEA

The HASSRA Cycling Challenge inspired me to create my own 'One Thousand' Cycle Challenge - ride 1000 miles and raise £1000 over July and August. My challenge included landmarks, including lakes, churches, castles and some pretty challenging hills. I started by making the most of a week's leave, completing two big personal challenges: Lakes Vyrnwy and Bala - both involving long distances and steep, lengthy climbs. I am so lucky to live in an area of such outstanding beauty, making the rides as awe-inspiring as they were arduous. I sent in a number of updates and pictures throughout the summer which were published on HASSRA Live. I tried to spend as much time as possible in the saddle, including cycling to work rather than driving, and it really paid off. I made it on both counts, reaching 1053 miles and raising over £1350. Cancer Research sent me a lovely cycling jersey to say thanks and I even won a prize in the HASSRA Cycling Sportive!

I was always planning to undertake some feat or other but it was the HASSRA Cycling Challenge that really made me focus and up the ante on last year. The big question now is how can I top this next year?!

# **Extra Support for Clubs**

Lockdown has been challenging for everyone and especially for staff in frontline departments like DWP and DHSC. National HASSRA wanted to recognise the efforts being made by all staff, whether in an office or at home, so we invited all HASSRA clubs to apply for a sum of money that could be used to boost staff morale. Nearly 600 grants were issued over the summer months to the tune of over £130k which has been spent in so many different ways.

Sheerness spruced up their staff entrance with floral displays, Dover held a colourful celebration of Pride, plus many offices around the country held raffles and competitions or handed out goody bags and pamper packs to staff in the office and at home.

However, one of the most inventive ideas came from Rochdale. Their Greatest Movie Challenge invited staff to recreate a scene from a movie and take a picture of it. There were two categories – Funniest and Most Realistic.

It could be done at home, in the office. in the park, the supermarket, wherever. There were nearly 40 entries and their grant was used for prizes for the winners.



# TRAINING IS KEY TO SUCCESS

The HASSRA Development Fund (HDF) is here to help you achieve your best in your chosen activity and has funds to help you overcome financial barriers to accessing your activity and making progress.

The fund is available to assist HASSRA members with a wide range of activities in the following categories:

**Sports & Leisure** – developing skills in your chosen activity where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include sports (including coaching and refereeing), arts and crafts.

**Volunteering & Community** – developing your potential to serve HASSRA or your local community where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include life skills coaching, youth worker, scout or guide leader, and so on.

With additional funding provided by the CSiS Charity Fund, members who consider themselves to be disad-van-taged or to have a disability may apply under the above categories for help either to take up a new activity or to realise their potential in an existing activity.

Nearly 1500 members have applied for funding so far with applicants achieving success at all levels, demonstrating HASSRA's commitment to both able-bodied and disabled members throughout the Association.

## Jenny (HASSRA North East) tells us,

"I have been a HASSRA member for many years and was vaguely aware of the HASSRA Development Fund but didn't think for a minute that it would be available to me.

I have always enjoyed exercising and taking care of my health. I've been fortunate enough to train with a personal trainer for the last five years. Earlier this year he asked me if I would be interested in becoming a personal trainer myself, to work alongside him in his fitness centre. I practically laughed out loud at the thought, but then, after thinking more about his proposal, I decided to take the plunge.

I researched all the potential costs and then decided to read through the HDF guidance on HASSRA Live. It states that anyone who is a HASSRA member and wants to develop skills in their chosen activity, and show where they have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more, can apply.

I wanted some help towards the cost of my online training course, so completed my application and submitted it. The form was straightforward and easy to complete. I received an email two weeks later advising that my application was successful and that the money would be transferred into my bank. It really was just as easy as that.

Six months on and I have completed, submitted and passed my Fitness Trainer online course with the help of the Development Fund. I am now taking a monthly Body Transformation Programme with a small group of women. Helping women similar to me is something I never dreamt I would do. Being able to train and inspire them to get back in shape and regain their confidence after having a family is something I love doing."

# Volunteer of the Year

I decided to take on a more active role and with the four remaining volunteers (Jacque, Rob, Helen & Gareth) we set a plan for reviving the club. I had a lot to learn and was very grateful of their guidance.

First thing we did was relaunch the club on our sites by promoting membership and rewards. We got everyone talking again about the benefits of being a HASSRA member. We tentatively arranged our AGM knowing that it was make or break for the club if we couldn't form a committee. We were overwhelmed by the response, formed a full committee and gained around 12 new volunteer reps! I became Club Secretary.

With more volunteers involved and contributing, we were able to once again run events. We arranged and supported fundraisers, promoted HASSRA Live, used comms to talk about offers and discounts, took part in a plastic clean-up operation, and arranged trips. We had a massive success with our Festive HASSRA Raffle which helped raise moral across the sites and united colleagues in our three areas of work.

In March 2020 I was thrilled to find out about my nomination for the award. Very disappointed when the AGM and award ceremony in Cardiff was cancelled due to the pandemic then to be honest it went out of my mind what with everything else going on! I was so pleased to find out months later that I'd won the Regional Volunteer Award.

I'd like to thank our Newport Club Committee (new and old), our volunteer reps, the people on the Wales HASSRA team who supported me and finally the very hardworking HASSRA members of the Newport club.





# HASSRA Summer Promotion 2020
