HASSRA Development Fund

The HASSRA Development Fund is here to help you achieve your best in your chosen activity and has funds to help you overcome financial barriers to accessing your activity and making progress.

The fund is available to assist HASSRA members with a wide range of activities in the following categories:

Sports & Leisure – developing skills in your chosen activity where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include sports (including coaching and refereeing), arts and crafts.

Volunteering – developing your potential to serve HASSRA or your local community where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include life skills coaching, youth worker, scout or guide leader, and so on.

With additional funding provided by the CSiS Charity Fund, members who consider themselves to be disadvantaged or to have a disability may apply under the above categories for help to take up a new activity or to realise their potential in an existing activity.

Over 1,500 members have applied for funding so far with applicants achieving success at all levels, demonstrating HASSRA's commitment to both non-disabled and disabled members throughout the Association.

Jose Rodriguez Barrera, HASSRA Scotland, tells us of his experience with the Development Fund:

"I have been playing Footgolf for five years and began playing competitively in 2019. I have already been fortunate enough to compete with some of the best Footgolf players in the world.

HASSRA's support through the Development Fund has made it possible for me to pursue my passion for Footgolf and compete in several competitions. Thanks to this funding, I was able to participate in the 2022 National Tour organised by the Footgolf Association of Scotland. This was a great opportunity for me to compete against some of the top players in the country and test my skills. I also competed in The Welsh Open, The English Open, and The Adeje Cup in Tenerife. These were all challenging competitions that pushed me to my limits and helped me improve my game.

Furthermore, I was able to participate in the Scottish National Club League with my club Bridgend FGC. We finished second in the league, which was a great achievement for us. HASSRA's funding helped cover some of the costs associated with participating in the league, such as travel expenses and equipment.

Overall, I am extremely grateful for the support provided by the HASSRA Development Fund. The funding helped me develop my skills in the sport and, without this assistance, it would have been so much harder for me to participate in these competitions and achieve the success I have so far. I would recommend the HASSRA Development Fund to anyone who want to achieve their goals."

HASSRA Leeds Quarry House member, lan Long, recently finished a yearlong running challenge, inspired by his brother and in aid of the Rob Burrow MND Centre, Seacroft Hospital. He tells us,

"My brother, Phil, also a HASSRA and Leeds Golf Society member of many years, was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease (MND) just over 15 months ago. MND is a rare condition affecting the brain and nerves. It is currently an incurable disease of devastating proportions that eventually leads to death, but some people can live with it for many years. Up to a couple of years ago it was a relatively unknown disease to most people. However, the running exploits of Sir Kevin Sinfield has brought MND into clear view and his love and affection for his best pal has moved all that have witnessed his amazing running feats.

It is only through this visibility that the number of people suffering th<u>e disease</u> has become apparent. Unfortunately, most of us will know someone who has been or will be diagnosed with MND. The disease is cruel, it removes a person's independence and dignity; it affects all those around - with loved ones becoming full time carers; and whilst some can
