HASSRA Cycling Challenge 2023

Keeping on the bike theme, we celebrate the triumphs of the recent **HASSRA Cycling Challenge**, showcasing the remarkable achievements of our dedicated members during the four weeks from 16th October to 12th November 2023.

Two categories defined this exhilarating event: the winner of the longest single ride was HASSRA North East's Michael Smith who reached an extraordinary 280km in one go. And if this wasn't impressive enough, HASSRA London's Paul Warren covered an astonishing 2,226km over the four weeks to become the winner of the longest overall distance.

Both category winners received £250, with second and third places winning £150 and £100 respectively. The enthusiasm didn't stop there as the collective efforts of over 50 HASSRA cyclists resulted in an awe-inspiring total of over 13,500 kilometres, underscoring the commitment and passion of our ever-growing cycling community. 20 of these participants were also chosen at random to receive £50 for taking part in this year's challenge. The **HASSRA Lottery** held its second Double Money Draw in October with every winner receiving twice as much cash as usual. Sarah Lewis from HASSRA West Midlands was the lucky jackpot winner, scooping a massive £30,000. She told us,

"I honestly can't remember how long I have been a HASSRA member. I have been in the Department for 25 years, so I guess a long time. The Lottery though, that is a more recent thing. Probably six years or so. I was in the office when I found out about my £30,000 win. I had a call from the HASSRA team querying why I had not claimed my prize. I was asked to log in to my account while she was on the phone. But it wouldn't accept my password. Then it wouldn't reset. I then kept getting the "too many attempts" message. I remember saying, "I am having such a bad day!" She replied, "I am sure it will get better!"

It was about an hour (and a good few swear words later) when I finally got into my account. I looked. Then I looked again. Then I just stared at it. I couldn't believe my eyes. I ended up shouting, "someone come look at my computer!"

My friend came over and the look on her face said it was real. I clicked on claim and called the lady back. After confirming I had actually won £30,000 she said, "I told you your day would get better." I still can't believe I won. I feel so incredibly lucky.

I have since paid off a few bills, bought far too many theatre tickets, booked a holiday and some weekends away, plus a few nice things for my family. My husband has bought a few things too. All things that I really need, apparently. He is so kind to me. Funny I never knew I needed a Ninja BBQ Smoker! The rest is safely tucked away for now.

I have previously won £200 on the HASSRA Lottery and thought I was exceptionally lucky then. I originally had three tickets but increased to five per month after my latest win - just in case! You never know.

RIGHT ON CUE WITH A HELPING HAND

HASSRA North West member, Tony Southern is a true legend of cue sports and a fine ambassador for pool, snooker and, in fact, any sport. Over the years, Tony has won four World Pool titles, countless European medals, 23 National snooker titles and is currently ranked World No. 1 on the World Disability Billiards and Snooker (WDBS) Tour.

In what Tony himself describes as the biggest win of his cue sports career, he has just won a Gold Medal for Team GB in the inaugural snooker event at the 2023 World Abilitysports Games in Thailand in December.

HASSRA is proud to have helped Tony over the years with financial assistance from the **HASSRA Development Fund**, which is there to help members achieve their potential in their chosen field.

In addition, he has multiple HASSRA titles at both regional and national level. If this roll of honour wasn't impressive enough, he also runs the British Pool Federation, Chairman of the British Wheelchair Pool Players Association, is involved in World Disability Billiards and Snooker, organises North West pool events and is part of the Predator Cues pro team.

Tony is a shining example of achieving success and overcoming the odds, even if you are handed a disadvantage by life. Tony told HASSRA, "I got into playing cue sports when I was 9 years old because my disability meant I couldn't go and play football with my friends without getting tired very easily. With sport at any level, disabled or not, you've got to go and give things a try! Never be afraid and never be afraid to compete with someone better than you — that's how you learn!"

Speaking of his setbacks and disability, Tony told us: "You've got to keep going and never give up. I always loved cue sports and saw my disability and any setbacks as a challenge. Never be afraid of challenges and always keep pushing yourself."

With help from <u>HASSRA Development Fund</u> and a huge amount of skill and dedication, Tony is a credit to his field and an inspiration to others. Keep it going in 2024, and beyond!




2023's Top Drawer

Marilyn describes her mum's passing away as the lowest point of her life.

"I went to a headspace where I'd lost somebody, put it to the back of my mind and thought, they'll be coming back. I didn't accept my mum's death and tried to keep busy. I wasn't coping at all - I took on too much at work and became exhausted."

Marilyn reached out to the Charity for Civil Servants and we listened. We provided her with space to breathe and a listening ear outside her circle of family and friends. After a supportive conversation and working out a plan together, we were able to pay towards counselling sessions through our partner organisation, Anxiety UK.

"The Charity for Civil Servants is just amazing and the people in the help team are like angels. There's always somebody you can talk to about anything. To be frank, I don't think I would have got through that point of my life without their guidance and support."

Marilyn completed her counselling sessions and took on effective coping mechanisms for the future. Practicing mindfulness and prioritising self-care are just a couple of the tools in the box. Marilyn wants to share her story in the hope of reminding others that even at their lowest points, there's always hope.

"The Charity for Civil Servants made me realise there's more to life, and that I've got good people around me. That's why I signpost my colleagues to the Charity and donate monthly. They're such a worthwhile cause and a benefit to every single civil servant."

Take A Step Forward

HASSRA membership doesn't have to just be about the benefits, discounts and activities that you can take advantage of. Being a HASSRA member also provides the opportunity to volunteer in many ways throughout the Association. Without our fantastic volunteers, many of your local and regional events and activities throughout the year simply wouldn't happen. Nigel 'Rocky' Williams, HASSRA Wales, is our recently crowned Volunteer of the Year. He tells us his HASSRA story.

"I was three weeks short of my 18th birthday when I joined the Department in 1978, based in Pontypridd. I don't know how many forms I signed on my first day, but the one I do remember was my HASSRA application. The office club secretary had told me about this wonderful organisation that operated at local, regional and national level covering all sorts of sporting activities including darts and quizzes, which are two of my passions, and I knew I wanted to be part of it.

I was just a regular member for a few years until a vacancy arose on the local committee. I started off by selling raffle tickets, taking names for different trips, and helping to organise entries to the regional quizzes and darts. I soon became club secretary and the HASSRA Wales Darts Organiser. Over the next 15 years, the club went from strength to strength with a good turnout for the HASSRA Wales Sports Day and getting to many regional finals, occasionally winning them.

I joined the HASSRA Wales Board of Management (BOM) in 2001 and was given a warm welcome by our then-Chair, Nigel Thomas and the whole committee. I also won a car in the HASSRA Lottery later that year but unfortunately wrote it off in an accident 15 months later.

I moved to the newly formed Debt Centre Wales in March 2003 and was elected treasurer at the inaugural AGM in June 2003. I continued in this role until 2020 when I swapped roles with the deputy treasurer when I took partial retirement. As a club, Debt Centre Wales won the HASSRA Wales Office Shield for Best Small Club for 3 out of 4 years at the HASSRA Wales AGM.

On a personal level, I was lucky enough to be part of the winning HASSRA Wales team at Special Event in Canterbury 2005 and was later named the HASSRA Wales Volunteer of the Year for 2005. I was subsequently invited the HASSRA Major Awards Dinner in May 2006, and I was completely gobsmacked when I was announced as the winner of National Volunteer of the Year. I don't remember much about my acceptance speech, except for thanking the HASSRA Wales BOM for their nomination and support, and I also questioned the sanity of the National Awards Committee for their decision!

In 2007, Wales hosted Special Event again and it was my job to co-ordinate the Athletics event, having previously arranged an open day for competitors and subsequent training sessions for the HASSRA Wales Team. Although HASSRA Wales did not win Special Event that year, I was so proud of the athletics team because they were the runners up in their event and had all exceeded their best recorded times and distances. Some of you reading this already know that my wife Michelle, aka Shelly, was part of that athletics team. Even though we didn't start dating until later that year, she has supported me with all my HASSRA activities ever since.

When it was announced that several clubs in South Wales would be re-located to a new super office at Ty Taf, just north of Cardiff, Ivolunteered to head up a working party for all the clubs involved. COVID struck soon after and virtual events became 'the norm' at every level of HASSRA. As things returned to normal, I was determined to re-launch the HASSRA Wales Sports Day and the HASSRA Wales darts championships in 2022, to re-kindle old friendships/rivalries. I knew my time at the DWP would end in August 2022, but I ensured that a constitution was in place for the super club, as well as the officials and committee.

We held our Sports Day in early May where I received long-service awards as Darts Organiser and a member of the HASSRA Wales BOM. I was over the moon a week later, when I had a WhatsApp message live from the National Awards evening telling me that I had won the National Volunteer of the Year again. HASSRA Wales Chair, Mandy Howells, collected it on my behalf as I was unable to attend due to being on a family holiday!

Back to the present and nearly 45 years after joining HASSRA, leventually received my second award

for National Volunteer of the Year at the HASSRA Wales Awards Dinner. Although it might have my name on the award, it's all down to teamwork and, over the decades, I've been lucky enough to work with some of the best.

To all members out there, if you get the chance to sell a few raffle tickets, do it. Get involved with your local club as you never know where it could lead."
