

HASSRA Development Fund

The HASSRA Development Fund (HDF) is here to help you achieve your best in your chosen activity and has funds to help you overcome financial barriers to accessing your activity and making progress.

The fund is available to assist HASSRA members with a wide range of activities in the following categories:

Sports & Leisure – developing skills in your chosen activity where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include sports (including coaching and refereeing), arts and crafts.

Volunteering & Community – developing your potential to serve HASSRA or your local community where you can show you have an existing interest and potential to go on and do more. Examples in this category include life skills coaching, youth worker, scout or guide leader, and so on.

With additional funding provided by the CSiS Charity Fund (see previous page), members who consider themselves to be disadvantaged or to have a disability may apply under the above categories for help either to take up a new activity or to realise their potential in an existing activity.

Nearly 1500 members have applied for funding so far with applicants achieving success at all levels, demonstrating HASSRA's commitment to both able-bodied and disabled members throughout the Association.

Sean (HASSRA North East) tells us,

Running is a big part of my life. I do it competitively, for fun and good causes.

I've completed road races, trail runs and even the odd obstacle course.

Before Covid, I was training for the Edinburgh marathon to raise money for Thomas Bewick School, a specialist provision for children with autism, and although my heart was in it unfortunately my legs were not.

I have always had problems with injuries. However, not until I increased my mileage had it become such a constant problem, restricting my ability to stay on track with my training.

After exhausting several options to remedy the issue, I was unsure if I would be able to continue with the training. With financial support from the HDF, I underwent a biomechanical assessment which identified that my foot strike was supinated - rolling to the outside when walking or running.

I was then able to take steps to correct the problem which might have not been possible without the help from the Fund.

Although the marathon has been postponed because of Covid, I have been able to continue training with far less injuries. While it is unclear if the marathon will go ahead this year, I am still very grateful for the help and support of the HDF.

Further Support for Clubs

These continue to be challenging times for everyone and especially staff in frontline departments like DWP and DHSC. Following the success of last year's Lockdown and Festive Grants, we are once again inviting HASSRA clubs to apply for a grant that can be used to help staff morale. We don't want to be prescriptive about how this money is used, we just hope it will go some way to making a difference, however small.

The scheme will run from 6th April, from when clubs will be able to apply for one payment each month until the end of July or until the money runs out - whichever is sooner. In the meantime, get thinking about what you can do to raise morale for as many members as possible.

Clubs used last year's grants in many ways: prizes for office quizzes or bingo, fitness trackers as prizes for step challenge, Bluetooth speakers for the office, goodie bags for colleagues.

Musselburgh Jobcentre used their Festive Grant Fund on a Virtual Christmas Lunch and some of Virtual Christmas activities. Doing things virtually allowed all staff to get involved, which was really important





Grangemouth JCP provided Xmas crackers and a selection box to all home workers, office staff and security, followed by virtual bingo with prizes



Walsall Bridle Court usually holds a barbecue each summer but 2020 saw a socially distanced and virtual Afternoon Tea using the grant. Food parcels were delivered to homeworkers, and Skype allowed everyone to catch up and have a natter.



HASSRA CHARITABLE FUNDRAISING FOR 2020.


